will focus on *evidence* and *theory* about our conscious experience embracing all three classical approaches:

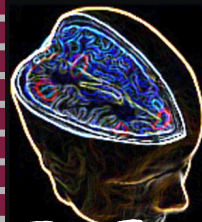
Personal, Intersubjective, & Scientific
